Industry News & Announcements

Status Update on NAHC's Home Health Payment Lawsuit

In July, NAHC filed a lawsuit against the U.S. Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services over home health payment cuts. On December 15, the Biden Administration responded by asking a federal judge to throw out this lawsuit. This was a predictable outcome according to NAHC President Bill Dombi.

CMS Releases 2024 DMEPOS Fee Schedule

On December 20, CMS published the 2024 DMEPOS Fee-for-Service Schedule. The fee schedule goes into effect on January 1, 2024 and includes the 2.6%-3% CPI-U adjustments previously announced on December 11, 2023. To view the 2024 fee schedule, click here.

National advocacy efforts continue for the extension of CARES Act relief rates. Legislation to extend the 75/25 blended rate for suppliers in non-rural areas was approved by the House Energy and Commerce Committee on December 6. The Senate Finance Committee passed similar legislation in early November. You can take action by using the AAHomecare advocacy tool that contains a pre-drafted message to your Senators and Representatives. There is still time before the January 19 deadline to help ensure the blended rate

extension is included among the healthcare provisions within the government funding package!



District of Columbia Updates

Direct Care Workforce Survey from the DC Coalition on Long Term Care

The DC Coalition on Long Term Care, Workforce Development Committee, continues to meet weekly to track and support workforce initiatives in the District. Several substantial legislative updates are featured below. As we prepare for the Performance Oversight and Budget Hearings in January 2024, it is critically important that the Coalition's testimony contains current industry workforce data.

If you are a licensed **Home Care Agency or Home Support Agency in the District, please complete the following survey – Long-term Care Direct Care Workforce Survey (Facility-based and HCBS) December 2023 (surveymonkey.com).** The survey is short - it should take only about 12 minutes to complete. Your responses are critically important and will be confidential.

Health Occupations Revision General Amendment Act of 2023

Mayor Bowser has proposed legislation that would amend the Health Occupations Revision Act of 1985. There is little in these amendments to alleviate the current healthcare workforce crisis and some provisions could make it worse by imposing new restrictions and more regulation on direct care workers and home health agency administrators. Among other things, the proposed amendments would:

- Create new authority for the Board of Nursing to license and regulate Home Health Care Administrators.
- Prohibit HHAs and CNAs from reinstating their certification if they fail to renew on time.
- Eliminate the ability of HHAs and CNAs to place their certification on inactive status.
- Lower the age of HHAs/CNAs to 16 but only under a new temporary certification that is not defined and would require new rulemaking.

A virtual hearing was held on December 7, 2023 and over 80 witnesses provided testimony. There were significant objections to the bill.

Direct Care Worker Amendment Act of 2023

This proposed legislation was introduced on November 6, 2023 by Councilmember Christina Henderson, Chair of the Committee on Health. The bill sets out to achieve the following:

- Establish a new minimum wage that is not less than 120% of the District Living Wage for all direct care workers.
- Require DC Health to establish a new universal credential for direct care workers that combines HHA and CNA competencies.
- Allow Maryland and Virginia HHAs and CNAs to work in the District.

A hearing is likely to be scheduled for January 2024, though no date has been confirmed.

Maryland Updates

The 2024 Legislative Session will run from January 10, 2024 to April 8, 2024. The MNCHA Legislative Committee, led by our lobbyist, Danna Kauffman, Esq., will convene weekly during session.

Members can sign up here for the weekly Committee meetings. It promises to be a busy session this year, don't miss your opportunity to help decide our position on proposed legislation that will be impactful to your home care business.

This will be hosted as a joint event again this year with our partners at LifeSpan Network, the Hospice & Palliative Care Network of Maryland, and the Maryland Association of Adult Day Services.
